
Scopay

Family Holidays in Term Time

Schools have a very full curriculum to follow within the term time given and any absence has a negative effect on a child's learning. Whilst we acknowledge that illness cannot be helped, holidays should be taken during school closure periods. Following Government expectations on attendance, no leave of absence/holiday will be authorised for any child, irrespective of their attendance, except for exceptional circumstances.

Any request for leave must be made in writing, addressed to the Headteacher. A response will be returned indicating whether leave is authorised. Any absence not authorised may be liable to a local authority penalty notice.

Packed Lunch Policy

At Haydonleigh we want to ensure that all packed lunches brought from home and consumed during the course of the school day, either on school premises or on school trips, provides the children with healthy and nutritious food that is similar to food served in schools which is regulated by National standards. The government has placed a duty on schools to ensure that every child is healthy and has invested heavily in improving school meals, free fruit for KS1 and the school food trust encouraged healthy eating.
